Idea of PCIC Europe in 2001

- ATEX issues main reason
- template IEEE-IAS-PCIC
- VDI chosen as conference organizer

1st PCIC Europe Conference in Basel 27-28 May 2004

- > 160 attendees
- > 15 countries
- 29 paper presentations

We need the exchange of known-how on an international level

he market of today is very competitive and international. Therefore it is essential that companies acquire and implement knowledge. What was valid yesterday may no longer apply in the everchanging economic landscape. In order to facilitate the exchange of up-to-date know how, several representatives of the European community of chemical, petroleum and pharmaceutical industries decided to hold a European Petroleum and Chemical Industry Conference (PCIC) in this field. Since this type of conference has been very successful in North America for the last 50 years, it was decided to use their template as a basis for a European conference.

The first step was to create an Executive Committee to define in detail the mission of the conference, its bylaws and the organization necessary to make it a success. The Executive Committee consists of representatives from France, Germany, Netherlands, Switzerland and the United Kingdom. The members are from end-user, engineering and manufacturing companies active in this industry.

The conference was held in Basle Switzerland on the 27th and 28th of May 2004. There were over 160 attendees from 15 countries to follow and to discuss the presentation of 29 papers. The wide range of subjects presented included the new ATEX directives, control of industrial electrical distribution systems, safety, product traceability, and knowledge-base systems to name a few. The basic principles of application-oriented papers based on past experience, and a strict policy of freedom from commercialism ensured high quality papers of interest to all participants as demonstrated by the interesting discussions after each presentation.

The vision of the Executive committee is "The PCIC Europe Conference will become the premier European forum for the exchange of experience of practical applications of electrical and instrumentation technology in the Petroleum, Chemical and Pharmaceutical Industries."

The mission of PCIC Europe is:

 To hold the European Conference on Electrical and Instrumentation Applications in the Petroleum, Chemical and Pharmaceutical Industry

- To support the exchange of experience and information among experts from endusers, engineering companies, manufacturers, the scientific community and government authorities
- To promote technology trends relating to electrical and instrumentation technology in the Petroleum, Chemical and Pharmaceutical Industry
- To sponsor appropriate European guidelines
- To provide opportunities for professional development
- To stimulate technological and economical progress.



- Networking during opening reception, in hospitality areas, at the bar ...

Additional benefits to attendees

Panel Discussions:

- Subject selected where no standard industry practice
- Exchange of ideas, suggestions, reality checks
- People speak for themselves, not the company they work for
- No written minutes of discussions

How to become a member of PCIC Europe






- Send application letter to PCIC Europe Chairman

- In 2012 HazardEx and PCIC Europe agreed on communication partnership through The Journal and our respective Conferences, Websites and Newsletters

Technical cooperation with IEEE-IAS

- Signed MoU with IAS (Industrial Applications Society)
 - Offers benefits to PCIC Europe authors and attendees
 - Mutual advertising of conferences
 - Totally separate legal entities, no financial ties, no other cooperation
- Grants access to IEEE Xplore data base to PCIC Europe authors
- Some PCIC Europe authors have republished papers in IAS journals
- Allows use of IEEE IACET membership to issue CEUs until 2012 to tutorial attendees
 - CEUs (Continuous Education Units) required in USA and Canada
 - IACET (International Association for Continuing Education & Training) has strict requirements - IEEE announced withdrawal from IACET in 2012
- MoU expires after 2014 PCIC Europe conference

Opportunities for IEC and IECEx with PCIC Europe

- 35 40 end users attend each conference
- End users are often absent from IEC working groups
- End users directly concerned by results of standardization work

Request: IEC to create a link to PCIC Europe to enhance exchanges between end users and standardization working groups

- End users and manufacturers face difficulties implementing IECEx
- Feedback also from engineering companies (fierce competition driving down prices and often reducing quality)

Request: PCIC Europe would like a member from an Ex C.B.

This will enhance feedback to IECEx already existing through IECEx participation at PCIC Europe conferences.

- Large concentration of senior engineers from end user organizations
