IEC Ex

The IECEx System currently runs three schemes:

- The IECEx Certified Equipment Scheme: International Certification Scheme covering products that meet the requirements of International Standards, e.g. IEC Standards prepared by TC (Technical Committee) 31: Equipment for explosive atmospheres
- The IECEx Certified Service Facilities Scheme: International Certification Scheme that covers the assessment and the on-site audit of organisations that provide services such as Repair and Overhaul service to the Ex industry.
- The IECEx Certified Persons Scheme: International Scheme for the certification of persons associated with equipment, installations and servicing used by Ex industries, e.g. oil and gas, coal mining, chemical plants, and so forth.

In addition, IECEx is also responsible for the IECEx Conformity Mark Licensing System, an International Conformity System where a Mark of Conformity is granted by approved ExCBs (IECEx certifiers) located in IECEx participating countries for equipment that is covered by an IECEx Certificate of Conformity and hence has been tested and manufactured under systems that are under ongoing surveillance by ExCBs.
